STRONGER TOGETHER, CELEBRATE THIS NATIONAL DAY

WITH OUR MIGRANT WORKERS

SINGAPORE, 01 AUGUST 2022: At first glance, Mr Nizamul Haque might seem like any typical migrant construction worker, working hard to contribute to the physical landscape in Singapore. But behind the high visibility vest and construction boots lies a man who has a deep passion for dancing. As the co-founder of [Migrant Dancer Singapore](#), Mr Haque has been using dance as an outlet to express his inner thoughts and feelings during his time here.

Besides Mr Haque, the stories of many other migrant workers will also have the chance to be heard at an upcoming month-long story showcase titled “Do You See Me?”. Held at **Tzu Chi Humanistic Youth Centre (HYC)**, it is organised in collaboration with [IAMinVISIBLE](#).

In line with Singapore’s National Day 2022 theme of being “Stronger Together”, the showcase tells the personal stories of 43 migrants and 9 change-makers from 8 countries through portraits, videos and self-expression. Running from **7 August 2022 to 31 August 2022**, it aims to bring visibility to the migrant community. By portraying our migrant

members beyond their job roles, it also hopes to draw commonality and cohesion between the migrant and Singaporean community. Additionally, the featuring of the 9 change-makers will aim to highlight the people who have been silently contributing to the migrant community behind the scenes.

The launch event will feature personal live story sharing and engagement with four representatives from Philippines, Indonesia, India and Bangladesh. There will also be original joint performances co-performed by both the migrant and Singaporean communities. Other activities would include arts and cultural exchanges through games, food, dance, music and tea appreciation. The Guest of Honour gracing the event would be **Member of Parliament for Nee Soon GRC, Derrick Goh.**
