

MEDIA INVITATION FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

CAN A CHINESE NEW YEAR CHARITY FAIR BE ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY?



SINGAPORE, 06 JANUARY 2023: At the Marina Bay countdown event involving 300,000 people in 2016, a massive 30,000 kg of rubbish was left behind by the crowd. Large-scale events and fairs are known to produce a great amount of trash, leaving behind damaging and irreversible impact on Mother Earth. Over the years, Tzu Chi has been trying to buck the trend and do its part for the environment, especially during the organisation's events such as the annual Tzu Chi Festive Charity Fair.

Since 2008, the charity fair has been adopting an eco-friendly theme. Some of the sustainable practices incorporated over the years have included the proper sorting

of recyclables and trash, recycling of food waste collected and use of reusable

tableware, among many others.

With the fair returning on-site for the first time after two years of the pandemic, the

sustainable practices will continue as well. There will be an emphasis on the

sorting of recyclables into different waste streams including plastics, paper and

metals, and reducing one-time use plastic. More than 150 volunteers will be

mobilised to help with the sorting of recyclables collected over the two-day fair.

Besides the eco-friendly practices, food sold at the fair will be solely plant-based

with 28 vegetarian stalls planned, and this will mean a lower carbon footprint.

Furthermore, to raise and strengthen the public's awareness of environmental

protection, there will also be educational messages displayed all around.

Ultimately, there is a wider aim to lower the total waste produced. Over the past

few editions of the charity fair involving between 10,000 to 20,000 people before

the pandemic, there was a decrease in the waste produced during the fair from 17

rubbish bins (660 litres) in 2018 to 10 bins in 2020. We hope to maintain this

number by minimising the waste produced to **10 bins** for this year.
